Professor Shihan de Silva Jayasuriya is a Senior Research Fellow at the Institute of Commonwealth Studies, School of Advanced Study (University of London), a Senior Associate, Lucy Cavendish College (University of Cambridge), a Lecturer in the Faculty of History (University of Cambridge), an elected Fellow of the Royal Asiatic Society (Great Britain & Ireland), a Collaborative Researcher (University of Colombo), Chair of the National Committee on Intangible Cultural Heritage, ICOMOS (Sri Lanka) and an expert on Afrodescendants in Asia, United Nations OHCHR (Geneva). She was a Visiting Professor at Ritsumeikan University (Kyoto), a Visiting Fellow at Lucy Cavendish College (University of Cambridge) and at the International Institute of Social History (Amsterdam), a Collaborative Lecturer, University of Hawaii and a winner of a Rama Watamull award, Center for South Asian Studies & Student Equity, Excellence and Diversity Award (USA), an elected Rapporteur of the UNESCO Slave Route Project (Paris), and a member of its International Scientific Committee. Amongst her six monographs are The Portuguese in the East: A Cultural History of a Maritime Trading Empire. She co-authored Land and Maritime Empires in the Indian Ocean, co-edited The African diaspora in the Indian Ocean, Uncovering the History of Africans in Asia and Sustaining Support for Intangible Cultural Heritage.
