These documents shall be sent to the Vice Chancellor through proper channel by each candidate with a covering letter applying for the award. The Establishments Division of the University shall handle the entire processing of applications.

D. Method of Evaluation

All the applications and documentary evidences will be evaluated by a panel appointed by the University Senate. Those appointed members/experts should assess teaching, research, creative work and other qualifications of the applicant based on documents submitted and they should allocate marks based on the Marking Scheme.

- 2. Rector/ Dean of a Fine Arts Campus/ Faculty/ Institute of other Universities
- 3. Two Senior Professor/ performing in the relevant field from other Universities
